## INTRODUCTION

- The multiplicity of labour laws and difficulty in complying with them has always been cited as an impediment to industrial development in India.
- In a major initiative for ensuring and promoting ease of doing business, the government has initiated a number of labour reform measures.
- Amendments have been proposed to labour laws to align them with the demands of a changing labour market.

# Labour Reform measures initiated by the central government.

- The Apprentice Act, 1961 was amended on 18.12.2014 to make it more responsive to industry and youth. An 'Apprentice Protsahan Yojana' was launched to support MSMEs in the manufacturing sector to engage apprentices.
- A unified labour portal scheme called 'Shram Suvidha Portal' has been launched for timely redressal of grievances and for creating a conducive environment for industrial development.

A National Career Service (NCS) is being implemented as a mission mode project to transform the National Employment Service to provide various jobrelated services.

- Pradhan Mantri Shram Yogi Man Dhan Yojana was started, in which provision was made for pension benefit of Rs 3,000 per month after reaching the age of 60.
- A digitisation of services to insured persons under the ESIA to integrate all its services so as to curb transaction costs.

### **NEW LABOUR CODE FOR INDIA**

- Government has repealed the non-useful Labour Laws and eventually 29 Labour Laws have been codified into 4 Labour Codes. The Central Government has amalgamated...
- \* 4 laws in the Wage Code,2019 for ensuring workers' right to minimum wages,
- \* 9 laws in the Social Security Code, 2020 in order to secure the right of workers for insurance, pension, gratuity, maternity benefit etc.
- I3 laws in the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 For providing better and safe environment along with occupational health and safety to workers at the work place
- \* 3 laws in the Industrial Relations Code, 2020 for safeguarding the interests of Trade Unions as well as the workers.

- The Central Government has made a headway towards changing the standard of living of workers in a fundamental manner through these Labour reforms.
- This will have positive and far reaching effect on workers and nation building.
- These Labour Reforms will enhance Ease of Doing Business in the country.
- Employment creation and output of workers will also get enhanced.
- The benefits of these four Labour Codes will be available to workers of both organized and unorganized sector.
- Now, Employees' Provident Fund (EPF), Employees' Pension Scheme (EPS) and coverage of all types of medical benefit under Employees' Insurance will be available to all workers.
