## Summary Report of the Departmental Seminar on "Problems and Prospects of Entrepreneurship in Assam"

On November 18, 2022, the Commerce Stream of Pramathesh Barua College, Gauripur, Assam, organized a seminar titled "Problems and Prospects of Entrepreneurship." ### **Inaugural Session:**


**Interactive Session:**
