THE REPORT

Introduction

In alignment with the transformative agenda of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) structure adopted by Gauhati University, the Commerce Stream, Pramathesh Barua College, Gauripur, organized an **Orientation Programme on Internship** for B. Com students on **24th June 2025**. The event was held in the college's **Digital Classroom** at **12:30 PM** and brought together faculty, students, and distinguished guests for an enlightening session on the significance and structure of internships in the newly implemented FYUGP framework.

The orientation aimed to familiarize students with the objectives, implementation strategies, and outcomes of internships as prescribed under the GU-FYUGP curriculum. With an emphasis on experiential learning, skill development, and career readiness, the programme underscored the value of integrating academic learning with practical industry exposure.

Objective of the Programme

The primary objectives of the Orientation Programme were:

- To sensitize B.Com students about the relevance and structure of the internship component under GU-FYUGP as per NEP 2020.
- To introduce students to internship modalities, expectations, deliverables, and evaluation criteria.
- To encourage students to develop professional competencies through real-world exposure in business and commercial environments.
- To highlight internship initiatives successfully undertaken by other institutions for replicability and inspiration.

Inaugural Session and Welcome Address

The Orientation Programme was initiated by **Dr. Gaurav Dutta**, Assistant Professor, Department of Accountancy, Pramathesh Barua College. In his **opening remarks**, Dr. Dutta warmly welcomed the dignitaries, faculty members, and students to the session. He emphasized

the critical importance of internships in shaping a student's professional trajectory, especially under the outcome-based structure of NEP 2020.

Dr. Dutta invited the **Guest Speaker, Dr. Gour Gopal Banik**, Professor, Girijananda Chowdhury University, Guwahati, and **Dr. Phatik Chandra Kalita**, Principal, Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Adarsha Mahavidyalaya, Tulungia, Bongaigaon, to the dais. He also extended invitations to the Heads of Departments from the Commerce Stream for their gracious presence on the stage.

Address by Dr. Phatik Chandra Kalita

He elaborated on how the **internship is not merely a curricular requirement** but a medium to bridge academic learning with on-ground commercial practices.

He also spoke about the **importance of documentation**, reflective journals, and evaluation matrices that are to be maintained by students during the internship period. Dr. Kalita's address served to clarify both logistical and pedagogical aspects of internship implementation under GU-FYUGP.

Keynote Presentation by Dr. Gour Gopal Banik

The core of the programme was the **keynote presentation** delivered by **Dr. Gour Gopal Banik**, a distinguished academician with vast experience in commerce education and curriculum planning. His session was marked by a blend of **informative content, real-life anecdotes**, and **student-friendly illustrations**, which made it immensely engaging for the attendees.

Dr. Banik began by emphasizing the **vision of NEP 2020**, which encourages **vocational exposure, multidisciplinary learning, and employability skills**. He then delved into the **internship guidelines prescribed by Gauhati University** under FYUGP, detailing:

- Duration and credit allocation for internships in the B. Com programme.
- Suggested timelines for conducting internships.
- Preferred sectors and organizations for internship placement.
- Expected student deliverables such as internship diaries, weekly reports, supervisor feedback, and final presentations.
- The role of faculty mentors and internship coordinators in guiding and evaluating students.

He also shared **model formats for internship reports**, along with a list of **suggestive themes** such as financial statement analysis, supply chain observation, customer service audits, inventory management, digital marketing campaigns, and HR practices in local enterprises.

Dr. Banik strongly encouraged students to **align their internship topics with future career aspirations**, and he also stressed the importance of **soft skills, punctuality, and ethical behaviour** during internships. His speech concluded with a motivational message urging students to seize internship opportunities as gateways to personal growth and professional development.

The presentation received **positive feedback** from both students and faculty members. **Dr. Gaurav Dutta**, in his post-session remarks, acknowledged the presentation as **informative, interactive, and truly enlightening**, particularly for students stepping into the professional world for the first time.

Going forward, the college plans to:


- **Establish MoUs and collaborations** with local businesses, financial institutions, government departments, and NGOs to serve as internship partners.

Conclusion


