The curriculum and syllabus of BA & Com Courses are designed in such

a manner that the students of both Honours and Regular courses are to study the courses of Indian Languages and culture which are integrated with Indian Knowledge system in appropriate manner. The majority students of the college study in Indian vernacular language as their medium of learning. Besides, the college provides courses of classical language like Sanskrit. The students are offered Modern Indian Languages as core subjects of studies for BA/B.Com Courses. The students are also provided Yoga course as add on courses in the college.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The college provides the UG-CBCS courses of BA and B.Com programme as per the syllabus of the affiliating Gauhati University as well as FYUGP under NEP 2020. The curriculum is designed on field based studies focusing on the principle of Outcome based Education. There is clarity and flexibility about the curriculum among the students and teachers. The students are facilitated education through traditional and ICT based classes as well. The students having Skill Enhancement Courses are to undergo field based and project based studies. The college provides facilities of computer based learning to the students as well. The process of teaching learning involves students taking responsibility for their goals.

20.Distance education/online education:

The college provides various courses through Open and Distance Learning system under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) and Open and Distance Learning Centre of Gauhati University. The college has the study centres of both KKHSOU and ODLC of Gauhati University with a motto 'education beyond barrier'. The differently able learners are provided free of cost courses of study through KKHSOU study centre. Many in service learners are benefitted from the KKHSOU study centre of the college for their higher studies. During Pandemic the college facilitated the students through online teaching as per the guidelines of Gauhati University. The Internal Evaluation as well as the External Examinations of Gauhati University were also conducted through online mode during the academic session 2023-2024. The college also encourages students to participate in SWAYAM courses.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

P.B. College, Gauripur, is permanently affiliated with Gauhati University. The curriculum for both undergraduate and postgraduate courses is designed by the Committee for Courses and Studies (CCS) of Gauhati University. This committee consists of faculty members from the university as well as from affiliated colleges. After thorough discussions and deliberations, the CCS formulates a comprehensive curriculum for each subject, which is then uploaded on the university's website for dissemination to all affiliated institutions.

As an affiliated college, P.B. College, Gauripur strictly adheres to the curriculum prescribed by Gauhati University. The planning and implementation of curriculum delivery commence with the preparation of a centrally coordinated class schedule by the college's Academic Council at the beginning of each academic session. This central routine is distributed to the heads of various teaching departments, who then develop departmental

timetables by allocating classes to faculty members along with designated time slots and classrooms.

Faculty members are required to prepare monthly teaching plans, which are followed by the submission of monthly course completion reports to ensure systematic and effective curriculum delivery.

The Examination Cell, in coordination with the Principal and Heads of Departments (HoDs), is responsible for determining the schedule of internal examinations. Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) is carried out based on multiple parameters, including students' attendance, home assignments, seminar presentations, and internal examinations, as applicable.

For 6th-semester students enrolled in various departments such as Commerce, Assamese, and Philosophy (Major/Honours) programs, the evaluation also includes the submission of project reports. The respective departments oversee this evaluation process, applying subject-specific criteria, and allotting marks accordingly.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Pramathesh Barua College, situated in Gauripur, primarily serves students from rural backgrounds, with a significant proportion belonging to marginalized communities such as Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, and Religious Minorities. To bridge the learning gaps among students, certain departments conduct entry-level assessments to identify slow and advanced learners. Based on the outcomes, remedial classes are provided for slow learners, followed by dedicated tutorial sessions to support their academic progress. Teachers closely monitor the development of these students to ensure continuous improvement.

To provide personalized attention, students are grouped under the Mentor-Mentee system, enabling focused guidance from faculty members. Regular verbal tests are conducted in classrooms to assess comprehension and reinforce learning. Additionally, students are encouraged to organize classroom seminars on course-related topics under the supervision of teachers. These seminars not only foster fresh perspectives but also help develop public speaking and presentation skills.

Some departments maintain regular communication with parents through parent-teacher meetings to discuss students' academic performance and well-being. Group study practices are actively promoted to enhance collaborative learning. Advanced learners are encouraged to support their peers, fostering teamwork and a spirit of mutual growth among students.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

To foster the all-round development of students, P.B. College, Gauripur, undertakes a wide range of student-centric activities. Students are regularly encouraged to participate in inter-college debates, quizzes, and various other competitions to enhance their skills and confidence. The college also organizes gender awareness camps and counseling sessions to promote social sensitivity and emotional well-being.

A variety of problem-solving methodologies are employed to improve critical thinking and analytical skills. Students are assigned academic tasks such as preparing assignments and participating in classroom tests, debates, and workshops to enrich their learning experiences. Educational tours are organized regularly to provide students with practical exposure, while field visits related to Environmental Studies and Skill Enhancement Courses, such as Historical Tourism of North East India, are conducted to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and real-world applications. Students are required to submit reports on these field visits as part of their curriculum.

Several departments actively publish wall magazines and newsletters on specific themes, encouraging creative expression and research-based writing. The college's Debating Society conducts debates and quizzes regularly to hone students' communication and critical thinking skills. Additionally, the

Electoral Literacy Club organizes programs to promote voter awareness and instil democratic values among students. This includes public speaking competitions, quizzes, and debates held on occasions such as Constitution Day and National Voters' Day. Students are also motivated to contribute to various literary magazines, fostering their literary and creative talents.
