The Women Cell of the college organized an awareness programme on cancer on 17th October, 2019 in the digital classroom of the college. Mrs. Jayantimala Chokrabortty and Sri. Dipak Chakrobortty, former professor in IIT Mumbai, was the resource person. Parvin Sultana, Asssitant Professor, department of Political Science introduced the guest and greeted them with a phulam gamocha. The programme typically aimed to educate the female students about cancer, its prevention, early detection, treatment options, and support services available. The noted speaker Jayantimala Chokrabortty focused on specific types of cancer, such as breast cancer particularly in case of women, and their impact on individuals. She enlightened that breast cancer affects both men and women, although it is more prevalent in women. She shared that cancer causes when cells in the breast grow out of control and form a tumor. She told about Rudali and how she works for cancer patients. The programme was attended by Ashoka Chokrabortty, former Principal of P.C. Institution H.S. School, Gauripur and Juin Das, Assistant Professor, Department of Assamese, Dhubri Girls' College, Dhubri as invited guests. Parvin Sultana offered vote of thanks to the invited speakers, guests and students with a positive note that the programme was aimed not only to increase knowledge but also to encourage students to proactive health behaviours and to reduce stigma associated with cancer diagnoses.
